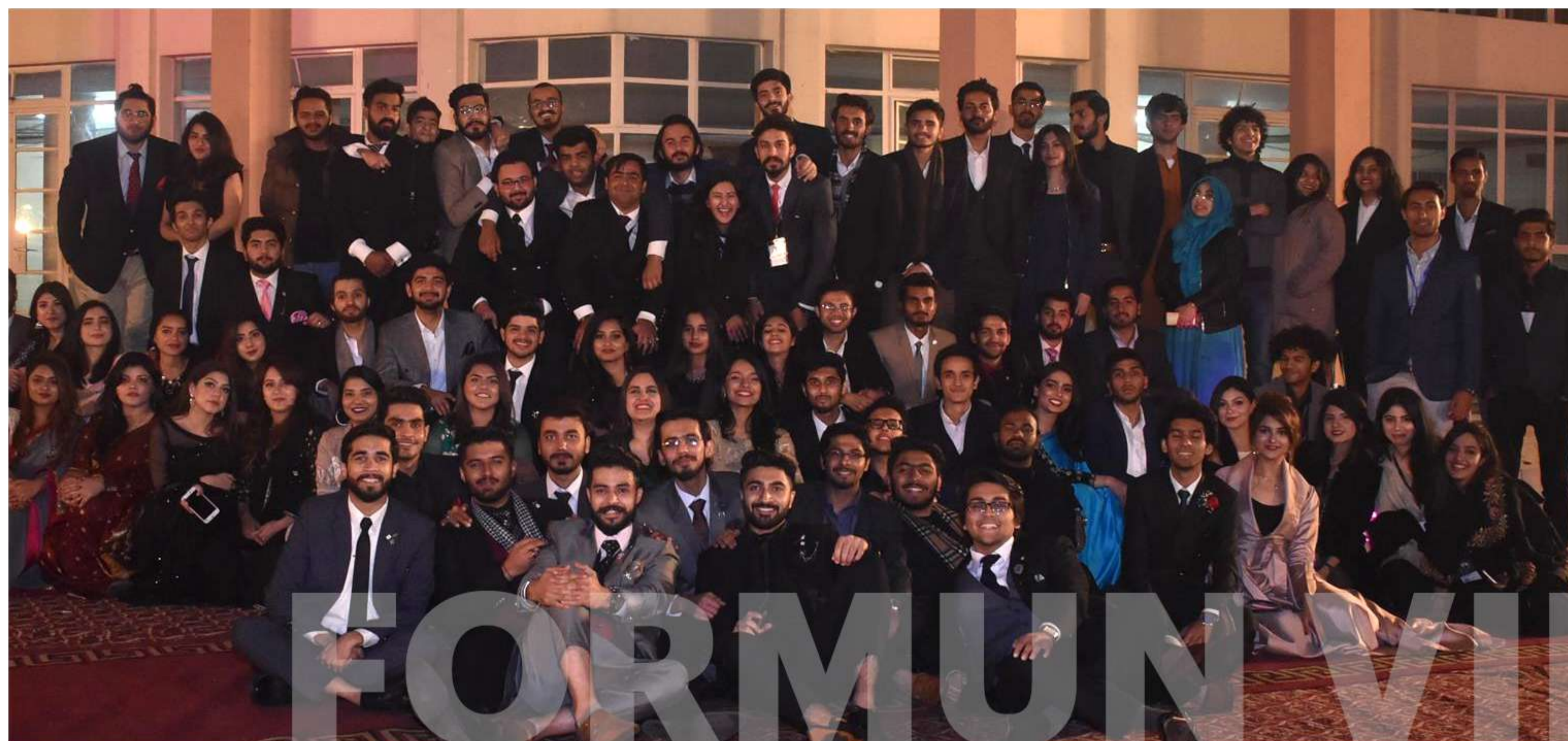

In April 2019, Office of Chief Proctor inducted a new team of proctors. This new addition has further improved the overall discipline situation, resulting in a conducive academic environment.

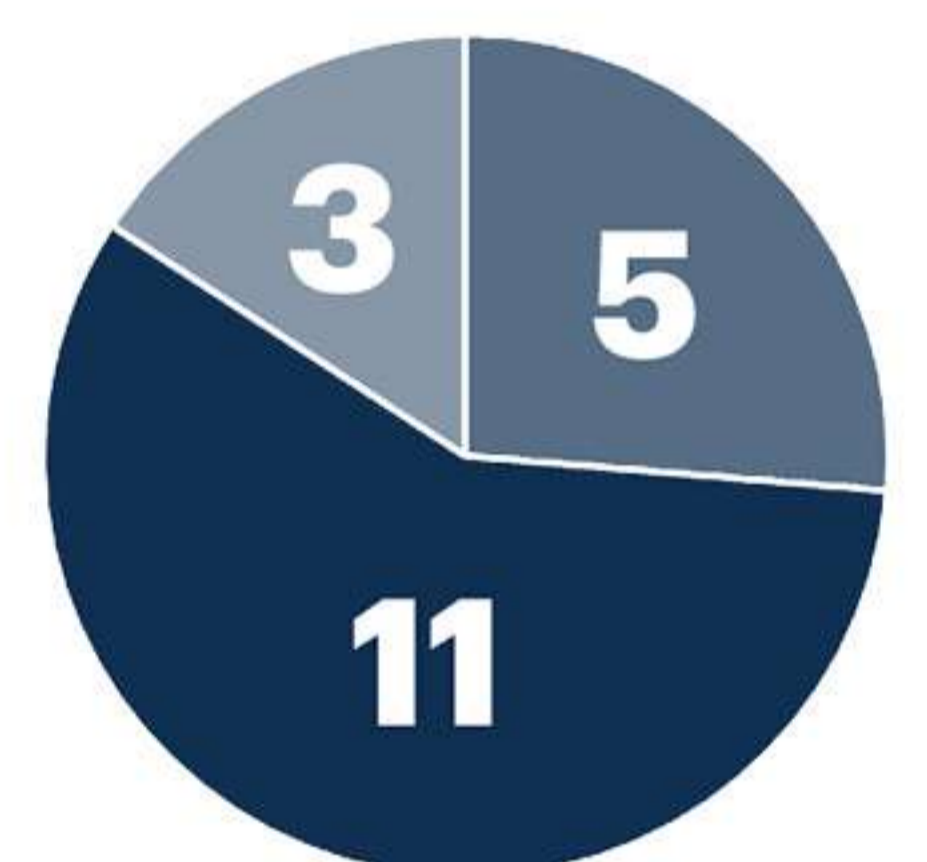

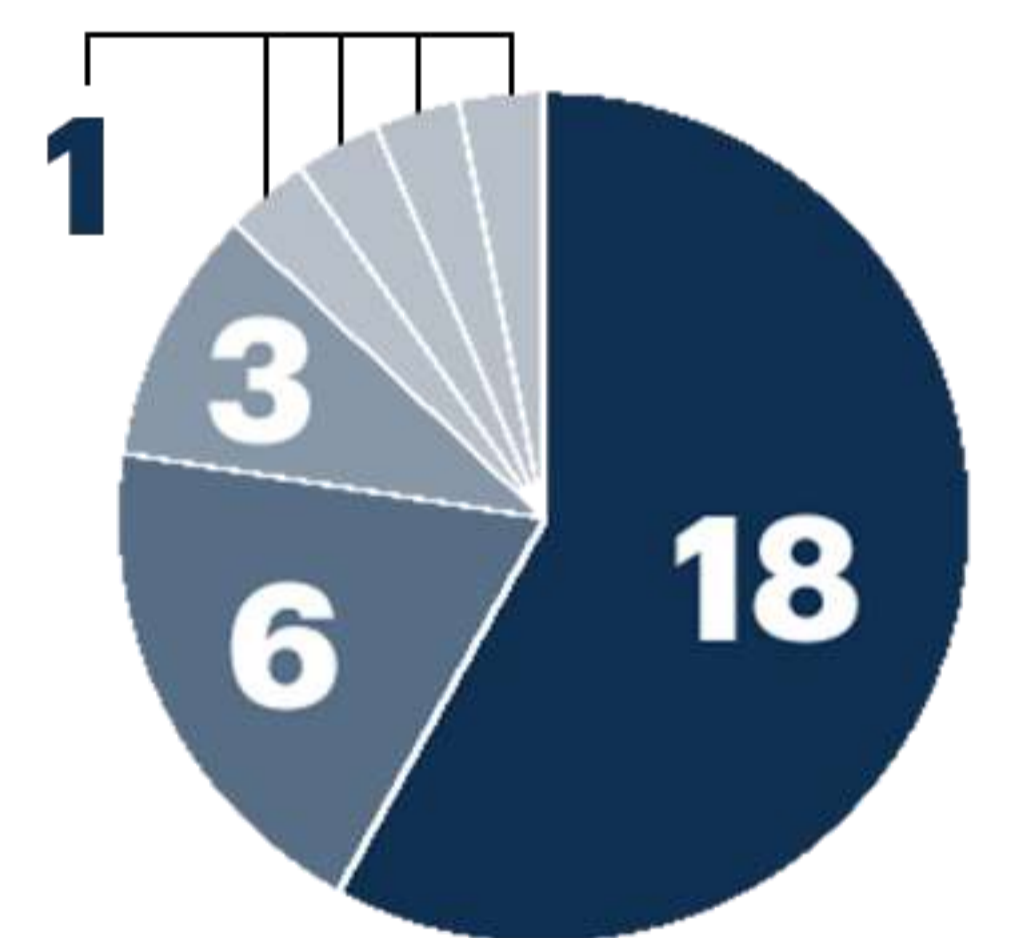
